However, the policy as assessed does not state that explicitly, nor does it underline that the procurement process can be completed in Welsh and that tenders submitted in Welsh will not be treated less favourably than those submitted in English.	The policy should include an explicit statement about PSOW duties under the Standards in core principles of the policy and in the tender template. The policy should state explicitly that tender invitations will be published bilingually and that PSOW welcomes tenders in Welsh. The policy should state that, in addition to its relevance to equality, all procurement should be assessed for its relevance to the Welsh language – with additional requirements set if applicable.
