Procurement is an area of operations falling under specific duties in Wales. It is recognised that procurement process may both disadvantage certain groups and offer opportunities to advance equality.

There is a risk that our procurement process may be less accessible to people from different backgrounds, including socio-economic backgrounds, people who want to communicate in Welsh, and to people with additional access needs. There is also a risk that in assessing bids we will consider some offers less favourably than others because of conscious or unconscious bias. The policy must ensure that that risk is minimised.

				There is a risk that through our procurement we will support suppliers who adopt practices contrary to our equality duties and commitments. The policy as currently formulated mitigates that risk by including of a statement on our duties in relation to equality in the core principles of the policy and to the tender template. The policy also states that all suppliers must be aware of PSOW equality duties and support PSOW in the fulfilment of those duties.	As above.			
				There is a risk that our procurement process will not be equally accessible to all groups. All PSOW procurement opportunities are advertised on Sell2Wales, a single platform and a go-to destination for all public sector procurement in Wales. This minimises the risk that some suppliers may not be aware of PSOW procurement opportunities. More specific risks and opportunities around access are discussed further below.	As above.

				Our procurement process presents an opportunity to advance and promote equality, by encouraging suppliers to develop or strengthen their equality policies and procedures. To realise that possible benefit, the policy as currently formulated sets out additional steps to strengthen the attention to equality considerations throughout the process. It includes: • a requirement for potential suppliers in procurements over £25k to demonstrate that they have satisfactory equality policies in relation to the services to be provided. • a simple process for assessing the relevance of PSOW procurement to equality. If this process identifies relevant impacts, it can lead to setting additional requirements for suppliers.	No further steps to enhance this positive impact have been identified.			
Age				There is no evidence that our procurement process is less accessible to any supplier due to age. We have not identified a specific risk that that may be the case, beyond a lack of awareness of our procurement opportunities.	We can use our existing contacts with organisations working with older people (e.g. Age Cymru; Age Connect) to share any news of our procurement opportunities.

				However, we are aware of the risk that suppliers with additional access needs deriving from disability may perceive or be apprehensive about such barriers and may require reasonable adjustments (for example, information in EasyRead or large print format). This risk is partially mitigated by the fact that all our procurement opportunities are published on the website, which means that they can be accessed using accessibility functions such as large print and BrowseAloud. However, these features are not available on Sell2Wales. Given this, suppliers with additional access needs due to disability may not be as aware as other groups of our procurement opportunities.	Moreover, it may not always be possible to accommodate requests for alternative, more accessible formats within the usual timeframe for responses to invitations to tender (3 weeks). Nevertheless, the possible negative impact can be mitigated by adding a following note in the tender template 'Please let us know if you require any additional assistance to engage in our procurement process. We will do our best to meet your needs'. We can use our existing contacts with organisations working with disabled people (e.g. Disability Wales; Learning Disability Wales; Autistic UK) to share any news of our procurement opportunities.

Socio- economic characteristics • rurality • low/no income • caring duties				There is a risk that our procurement process will be less accessible to small local suppliers. However, the analysis of our procurement activities shows that we use such suppliers commonly, though mainly for lower-value procurements. This risk is mitigated as follows: The policy states that PSOW will encourage participation of smaller local suppliers. Our Sell2 Wales posts invite tender bids from across Wales, except for procurements that are locality specific (e.g. cleaning contract) The nature and limited scope of PSOW procurement over £25,000 makes it difficult to ascertain more detailed regional trends that could lead to introduction of more specific changes to the policy at this stage.

Internal analysis of past procurements

- the number of tender exercises conducted by PSOW each year is very small (around 1/2 per year)
- these procurements relate to services that are needed to be provided to the organisation rather than being people-orientated
- based on the last few procurement exercises, evidence suggests that the type of suppliers PSOW attracts are typically from within Wales.

We use local suppliers where possible and in the last 12 months we have used small independent companies based in Bridgend for our counselling service, office cleaning, catering, car hire and stationery. We also use an independent company as our external reviewer and have moved in the last 12 months to using 2 small independent Welsh suppliers for our building management and review services rather than a large UK wide company. Independent Welsh suppliers also provide our political monitoring and external design service.

Evaluation of equality in procurement assessment tool

We used the tool at the planning stage of procurement activity, and we employed it more extensively in one tender exercise, resulting in adding a few additional relevant questions in the tender document.
